Discussion „Feminist Researchers Exploring Young African Men Living and Performing Blackness in the Diaspora“ (Zoom)

Wednesday, 28 October 2020, 3-4.30 p.m. CET

The work presented in this discussion forms part of an on-going collaborative project between initially two, and subsequently three African women who are passionate about understanding masculinities. In this lecture, the intersections of race and gender will be explored (and to a lesser extent class and geo-political location) in the ways in which young black men read, experience, navigate, (de)construct, and perform their lives as black men in spaces that are only sometimes considered to be home in the African diaspora. The racialization of black bodies, the performance of black African masculinities in white spaces, as well as strategies of survival and resistance will be discussed. The work's uniqueness is found in the decolonial feminist approaches, and the conversations carried out among men spanning three continents and nine cities.
